Caution Regarding Thin Ice

As we are heading into winter it is important to remember and follow water and ice safety. The City of Edmonton provides the following information regarding water surfaces in the winter:

Student and family safety is our concern - use ice surfaces at your own risk. Obey the posted signs and information at ice surfaces to reduce the risk of injury.

Ice Thickness

There are many factors that can affect ice thickness including location, the time of year and environmental factors such as:

- Water depth and size of body of water
- Currents, tides and other moving water
- Chemicals including salt
- Fluctuations in water levels
- Logs, rocks and docks absorbing heat from the sun
- Changing air temperature
- Shock waves from vehicles travelling on the ice

North Saskatchewan River

It's never safe to walk on the ice of the North Saskatchewan River as water is continuously flowing beneath the surface which impacts ice thickness.

Stormwater Lakes and Ponds

Stormwater facilities aren't safe for any type of recreation because the inlet and outlet pipes keep water continuously flowing beneath the frozen top layer.
